Take WPA the summer prior to Junior Semester I

The score you earn on the WPA will dictate the classes you need for your junior year and may impact your graduation date.

Score:

8 or above: No further lower division writing classes required.

Less than an 8: Ling/RWS– Required by the university.

Ling/RWS – Required by Liberal Studies
