The National Dual Language Consortium defines dual language programs for elementary school dual language programs, regardless of the population, as those that use the partner language (the language other than English) for at least 50% of the instructional day. This is the same definition used by [California Department of Education \(CDE\)](#) and [Center for Applied Linguistics \(CAL\)](#) to develop their directories. The number of dual language schools continues to [grow](#).

NOTE: The schools on our San Diego dual language directory are self-reported. In addition, our dual language directory includes both two-way and one-way programs.

Definition Key:

Program Types:

One-Way FL– Foreign Language immersion programs for English only or English proficient students

One-Way DEV - Developmental one-way programs for English Learners and/or English proficient students

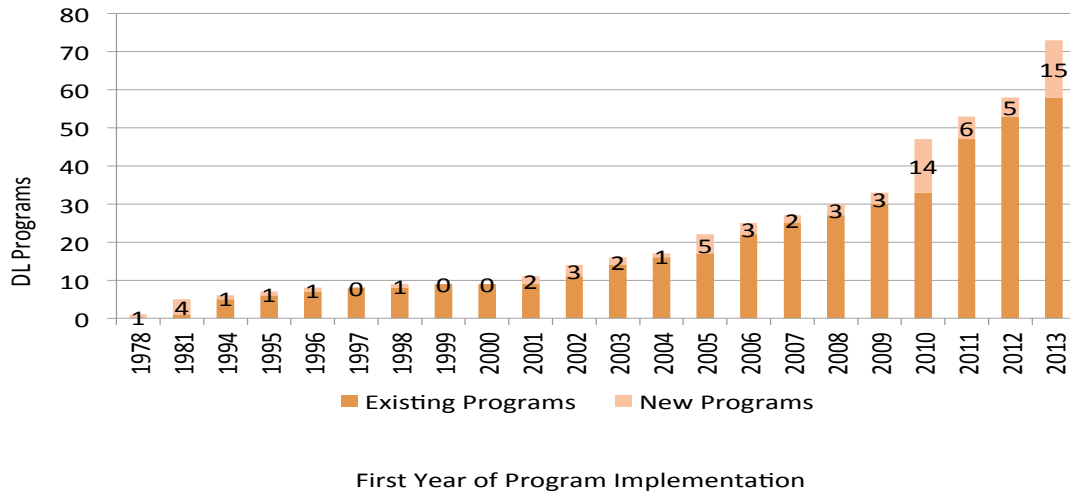
Two-Way – Programs which have both English only or English proficient students and English learner students (a minimum 1/3 of students to a maximum of 1/2 of students from each group)

Program Models:

Program models refer to the amount of instruction in the partner language students receive in kindergarten (i.e. 90/10, means 90% of instruction is in Spanish, 10% in English). All Elementary Dual Language Programs use a minimum of 50% instruction in the partner language in kindergarten through 6th grade.

Secondary programs include at least two courses in partner language - language arts and content (i.e. social studies or science or math).

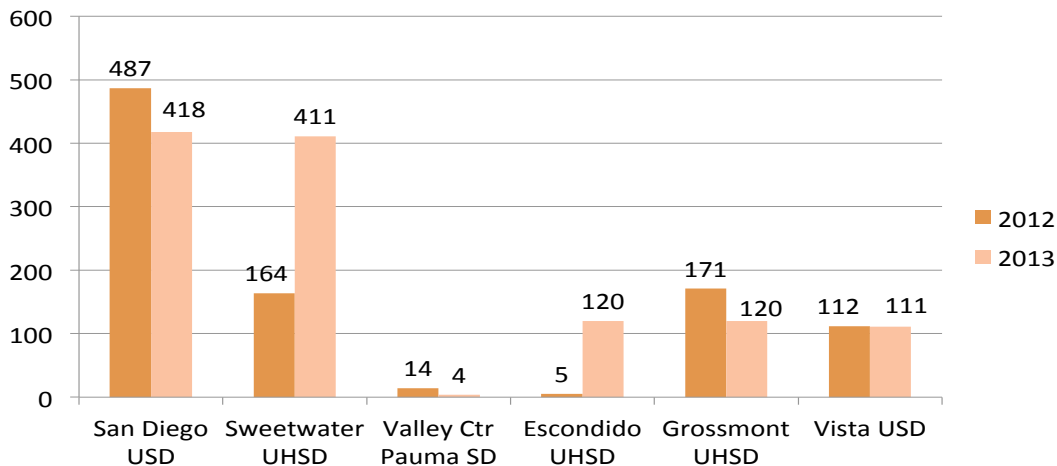
The Seal of Biliteracy is an award given by a school, school district or county office of education in recognition of students who have studied and attained proficiency in two or more languages by high school graduation. Appearing on the transcript of the graduating senior, the Seal of Biliteracy is a statement of accomplishment for future employers and for college admissions.

State Seal of Biliteracy

In 2013 the number of Seal of Biliteracy recipients nearly doubled – 19,585 compared to 10,885 (2012). The participating organizations included 170 LEAs, 19 charter schools, and 6 county offices of education also doubled. The leading language was Spanish (74%) followed by French (11%) with other languages at 4%.
