Transgender

An umbrella term for people whose gender identity, expression or behavior is different from those typically associated with their assigned sex at birth, including but not limited to transsexuals, cross-dressers, androgynous people, genderqueers, and gender non-conforming people. Transgender is a broad term and is good for non-transgender people to use. 'Trans' is shorthand for 'transgender.'"

Transgender Day of Remembrance:

"The Transgender Day of Remembrance was set aside to memorialize those who were killed due to anti-transgender hatred or prejudice. The event is held in November to honor Rita Hester, whose [1998] murder, [...] like most anti-transgender murder cases, has yet to be solved. It raises public awareness of hate crimes against transgender people, an action that current media doesn't perform. Day of Remembrance publicly mourns and honors the lives of our brothers and sisters who might otherwise be forgotten. "

Violence

Those in the transgender community experience violence in disproportionately high numbers compared to other communities:

- People who identify as transgender are **28% more likely to experience physical violence** than those who are gender normative.
- 19% have experienced domestic violence at the hands of a family member because of their transgender identity or gender nonconformity
- 53.8% of anti-LGBTQ homicide victims in 2012 were transgender women.
- Transgender people of color are 2.46 times as likely to experience <u>physical violence</u> by the police compared to white nontransgender people.
- Trans people have also experienced violence at the hands of health care professionals: 26% experiencing physical assault and 10% living through sexual assault.
- Multiple studies indicate that over 50% of transgender people
 have experienced sexual violence at some point in their lives. This
 rate is nearly double (1 in 3 girls) or triple (1 in 6 boys) the commonly reported rates of sexual abuse.
