Disability Advisory Committee Scholarship



Applications are now being accepted for the 2017 [Disability Advisory Committee \(DAC\)](#) and the [\(DAC\)/California Transportation Foundation \(CTF\) scholarships!](#) This year the **DAC** and the **DAC/CTF** will each award a scholarship, in the amount of \$1,000.00 each.

Applicants must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Recipient must be a US citizen or legal resident of the State of California
- Recipient must be a high school senior or college student (undergraduate or graduate).
- Recipient must have a permanent disability defined by the Fair Employment and Housing Act (FEHA) as having a mental or physical impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities.
- Recipient of the **DAC/CTF** scholarship should plan on using their education to contribute to the enrichment of transportation in California.
- Recipient of the **DAC** scholarship can be enrolled in any field of study.
- Recipient must have a minimum 2.0 GPA.
