

San Diego State University offers a process for students with verified disabilities to request special consideration during the admissions process. This process is established to provide consideration about an applicant's documented disability or related circumstances which may have had an impact on one's academic profile, grades or other factors considered in the admissions process. It is the applicant's responsibility to seek special consideration in accordance with the steps outlined below:

Special Admission Consideration Process:

- Step 1:** Apply for admission through Cal State Apply www.calstate.edu/apply. Student must submit admission application for fall term between October 1 and November 30th. SDSU does not accept spring 2018 undergraduate applications.
- Step 2:** Complete and submit a **Special Admission Consideration Form** https://newscenter.sdsu.edu/student_affairs/sds/files/08540-SBP_Consideration_Form_SDS_2017.pdf and supporting documentation to Student Disability Services by **December 15**.

Required Documentation:

- A completed Special Admission Consideration Application form
- A personal statement
- Two letters of recommendation
- Current verification of disability
- Official high school transcript (must be in sealed envelope from high school)
- College transcripts if applicable

Applicants who do not self-identify or meet this deadline, will be required to go through the SDSU admission ranking process. If applicant is not offered admission, they may submit a formal admission appeal to be considered for the Fall term.

- Step 3:** Student Disability Services review all complete applications and provide recommendation to Enrollment Services. SDS will notify applicants once a recommendation has been sent to Enrollment Services.

Enrollment Services makes the final decisions on all Special Admission Consideration requests.
