Important note about Financial Aid

You may have loans available to you that appear on your AidLink portal. Please remember **you must activate your loans** in order to be able to access them. If you know you are planning a study abroad program in the future, you may also want to activate any unused loans before the deadline listed in AidLink THIS SEMESTER to save and utilize for study abroad (however, be sure to save these funds and not spend them yet!) In addition to the Financial Aid you are typically awarded, you may see an adjustment in your award amount during the term you decide to study abroad. Financial Aid can many times provide more access to loans and (more rarely) grants to help you pay for additional costs incurred by study abroad. Even if you do not typically apply for FAFSA / Financial Aid, we encourage you to consider applying for the term you will be abroad. We recommend meeting with a Financial Aid advisor for any questions.
